While online feedback can provide some information, talking with one of their clients can always give you more information than you would gain from online feedback.

Assessing Capacity and Resources for Large Scale Work

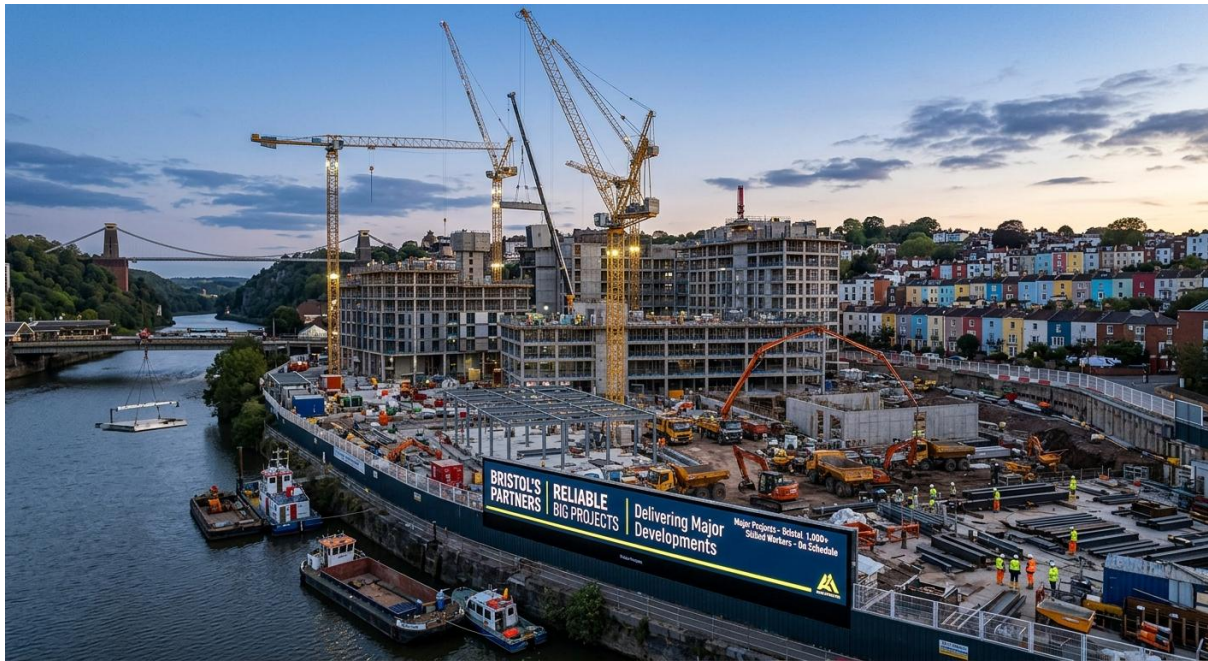
Even when a firm is known to be reputable, it is still possible that the firm is overloaded with other projects to an extent where they cannot effectively handle your project.

Find out the number of projects that the company is currently handling and the number of people they have available to undertake your construction project. It is important to know whether the company uses its own equipment for work or if it hires the equipment. A company with good internal capabilities will be able to focus on your project effectively throughout the process.

How Project Management Affects Big Build Outcomes

Good project management usually accounts for the primary difference between a project's success and failure. The project manager becomes the focal point for the coordination of the trades and for monitoring their progress relative to the schedule, as well as identifying any potential problems that may arise during the course of the project.

- A complete project schedule per phase
- Defined milestone dates with deliverables
- Procedures on how delays will be reported immediately they occur
- Provision for contingency time allowance in case of weather or shortages
- Scheduling of progress review meetings after each milestone
